LUBERON Rosé

Maison Louis Bernard, based in Gigondas, France, was founded in 1976 in the heart of the Rhône Valley and its renowned Crus. Over the past 20 years, we have established close partnerships with more than 20 respected vineyards owners.

Luberon became an “Appellation d’Origine Protégée” in 1988. The vineyards sit in fabulous natural surroundings, within the heart of the **Luberon Regional Park**.

Le **Domaine des Vaudois**, founded in **1905**, is set amid 44 acres of grapevines and olive trees. Facing southward, in layered terraces composed of clay-limestone soils, the vines are planted in an area developed in Gallo-Roman times.

This estate takes its name from a religious community whose members, the Waldensians, were persecuted and fled to the hills of Luberon during the 14th Century. As descendant of this community, **François Aurouze** wanted to honour it by using the name of Vaudois. Descended from a long line of farmers, viticulturalist, he passionately pursues the agricultural traditions of his ancestors. He cultivates the vine combining tradition and modernism.

Grape varieties : Black Grenache, Syrah and Cinsault

Winemaking : The grapes are harvested when the berries are fully mature. They are cropped in the morning to take advantage of the freshness and to then keep all the fruits’ aromas. A careful process called ‘saignée’ (bleeding) gives the wine its bright colour while extracting more flavours.

Tasting notes : Light bright rose colour. Very aromatic floral aromas and great freshness in mouth.

Serving suggestion : Best served young and chilled between 17-18°C .

Food pairing : Friendly wine, perfect with grilled meat, barbecues, salads, vegetable gratin, delicatessen or on its own.
